## **Description of necessary first aid measures**

Eye contact

Inhalation

: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. ## Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

#### **Precautions for safe handling**

**Protective measures**

# Appropriate engineering controls

: Use only with adequate ventilation.
